It was humbling to read about this side of her, because it wasn't a side that was ever really shown. Now I know why. We didn't see it because in her daily life she diligently gave those insecurities to the Lord and He would fill up her cup and give her strength for that day! She was reassured in her purpose and in His love for her. Grammy would obediently give Him her time, and He would keep His promises to her. It was a beautiful relationship. One that I aim for more daily ever since she passed away.

He has promised to supply every need we have. The Bible says in Philippians 4:19: "But my God shall supply

There is no lead singer. Amazingly, most of the people who come and who can sing, do a good job keeping together. At times someone will sing ahead or lag behind. There are also lots of distractions as well. We have a good time and I feel the Lord knows we are worshiping Him and that we appreciate Him and also the great country He has given us.

It takes a lot of concentration for me not to get distracted and lose my place, so I try hard to tune out anything that will throw me off, and keep on playing the music. It was toward the end of the hour and something was *Very Different*! I kept playing. No one said anything was amiss. Then Mabel announced the next song in the line-up. I said, "We just did that one."

That's when it all became clear! Something had gotten mixed up! I'd been playing the good old campground song, *Do Lord, Oh Do Lord, Oh Do Remember Me*, and the group had been singing *This Little Light of Mine*! We all had a good old-fashioned laugh, then proceeded to play each song – separately!

We made a special note that we'd done exactly what the Bible says to do. Psalm 98:1 says "Sing to the Lord a new song."

Later, at home, I played *Do Lord* while singing *This Little Light of Mine*. It sounded BEAUTIFUL! Besides, how could it go wrong when we were following scripture, even if we didn't realize it!

Residual debris was cleaned up and he and Robert took a load to the dump. Then, of course, we had to go eat! That's what we do best! The next step for the Trustees is to set priorities. We will be giving you more information and details shortly. We did want to let you know we are very excited about the plans and working together to accomplish them. Seeing a project come to fruition is so satisfying, and enthusiasm is contagious. The Trustees will be welcoming your participation, as you can, to keep God's house in tip-top shape.
