A HEARTFELT THANK YOU FOR MAYHEW CBC'S CHRISTMAS GIFTS TO ABRAHAM LINCOLN ELEMENTARY SCHOOL FAMILIES



Happy New Year! I hope that this note finds you in good health and good spirits, and that all of you had an enjoyable holiday season. I was so pleased to get an e-mail from Ted before Christmas, letting me know that you were able to return to meeting with one another, and absolutely delighted to learn that you wanted to provide some holiday support for families in the Lincoln Village and Countryside neighborhoods again this year. Your contact and generosity could not have come at a better time, and I am pleased to share information about the impact your kindness had on two Abraham Lincoln Elementary School families.

As you may already know, we strive to ensure that your donation provides much-needed support for families experiencing difficult life circumstances. Over the years, your generosity has supported families who had recently lost loved ones, that had lost most of their possessions to fire, to those who lost their jobs during the Great Recession, to a Middle Eastern family separated by arcane immigration laws, as well as to provide some holiday cheer to children whose parents were incarcerated or otherwise unavailable to them, and who were being raised by extended family.

Each year, your kindness has been a beacon of hope and humanity for the families whose lives you've touched, and this year is no exception. In consultation with school staff, the decision was made to focus your donation on two families, one, a single dad with two children, and the other, a couple with four children. While both families are currently sheltered, each has experienced homelessness in the past 18 months, due to the impact of the Pandemic. The parents in both families are working multiple jobs in an effort to get back on their feet, and your donation could not have come at a better time. Both families requested a gift card from Walmart, not knowing how much they would be receiving. When the \$350 cards were delivered, the tears were difficult to hold back, as they talked about the difficulties each of them was experiencing trying to provide basic needs for their families, let alone some Christmas gifts.

Ladies and gentlemen, your generosity not only allowed these parents to give their children some gifts, it also put food on their tables. Your gift freed up money that could then be used to put gas in their vehicles so they could get back and forth between home and work. Your generosity made a <u>significant</u> difference in the lives and well-being of these two families. An interesting side note: when I delivered the gift card to one of the families, I realized I was at the home of a family that your donation had helped several years ago; they had opened their doors to this family as they worked to get back on their feet. It was as though things had come full circle, a true pay it forward kind of moment!

My deepest thanks to all of you for support of families in need in our community, and for allowing me to play a small role in delivering that support; it is a great honor indeed. I wish you all health and happiness in 2022, and hope that the blessings you have bestowed upon others return to you tenfold.

When will Christ return and start his Millenial Reign. Who will be part of this?


What is the Final Judgment?

REPORT FROM THE BOARD OF CHRISTIAN EDUCATION (From Annual Report)

Greetings to you all from the bosom of the father of lights and spirits, Yahweh the great God Jehovah and His Son Yeshua (Jesus Christ) the LORD King.

Last year and the years before were filled with so many differences of opinions and perspectives. Allow me to borrow the school of thought from the writings of Charles Dicken's book <u>A Tale of Two Cities</u> to express the accurate rendering of the times and seasons that eclipsed us in the last two years of the church history. Charles Dickens stated that "It was the best of times, it was the worst of times, it was the age of wisdom, it was the age of foolishness, ... it was the season of Light, it was the season of Darkness, it was the spring of hope, it was the winter of despair, we had everything before us, we had nothing before us, we were all going direct to Heaven, we were all going direct the other way—in short, the period was so far like the present period, that some of its noisiest authorities insisted on its being received, for good or for evil, in the superlative degree of comparison only."

Dickens' strategic analysis of the crucial times of his generation is the accurate representation of the times and seasons that we are in. The church both locally and globally experienced challenging times because of the chaos and confusion that was lurking at every angle of society. However, one evening after men's class, Pastor Mike and I were in the parking lot having a discussion concerning the times, and he made a statement that stuck with me for a while. He said, "out of the ashes we have to rise," just like the phoenix bird in its symbolic representation embodies the rising from the ashes of ruins and life to soaring higher in beauty and glory.

Moreover, in Isaiah 61:1-3, the Lord through the Prophet Isaiah states that He will give us beauty instead of ashes, heal the broken hearted, lift the spirit of heaviness off and give us garments of Praise. God indeed has turned our mourning into dancing during these tumultuous times by rewriting the scripts of the destiny of the church. We lost the Yattiyr school family but God is bringing us youth to replace the void and space left behind. I believe it's a season of passing of torches to the next generation and thanks be unto God that works out everything for our good. The Youth of Yattiyr is passing the torch to the next generation of youth that God is bringing to this church.

The torch of leadership for the Christian Education was passed unto me last year as an interim leader, and I have seen much progress and changes in this short period of time. Answer to Bible Question on p.9. It was a Canaanite woman (a gentile) whose daughter was vexed with a devil. She pleaded for Jesus to have mercy on her, but he did not answer her. The disciples asked Him to send her away. But Jesus answered and said "I am not sent but unto the lost sheep of the house of Israel." Then she came and worshiped him, saying, "Lord help me." But he answered and said, "It is not meet to take the children's bread, and to cast it to dogs." And she said, "Truth, Lord: yet the dogs eat of the crumbs which fall from their master's table." Then Jesus answered and said "O woman, 'great is thy faith; be it unto thee even as thou wilt.' And her daughter was made whole from that very hour." Commentary: Jesus was testing the woman's faith, which was rewarded by a miraculous healing. "Children" means Jews and "dogs" (aka the pets under the table) refers to gentiles. Her statement meant that she knew what could be hers, even as a Gentile, and this became an illustration of millions of gentiles who would later be blessed by Israel's Messiah. *Matthew* 15:26-28.

REPORT FROM THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES (Revised and updated from the Annual Report)

While many activities were on hold or reduced during the year due to Covid-19, the Trustees were very busy.

The amazing blessings of the church parking lot resurface and the three refrigerators remain in our hearts.

Miscellaneous Projects: Numerous tasks were on the Trustees' plate, including plumbing projects, hardware and other repairs to the buildings, a broken window and ripped screen in Crone Hall, professional cleaning of carpets and tile in the Sanctuary, Satow Hall, Crone Hall, the foyer, hall and restrooms, fallen tree limbs, another dangerous tree condition, and seeking a permit from the City to remove a huge oak tree (which was denied).

Nursery Remodel: There is light at the end of the tunnel regarding the nursery room. A new air condition/heating unit is being put in by Pastor Mike and Doug. Texturing and painting will be happening soon and then the flooring will be installed. Private donations are paying for almost everything! What would we do without the caring and generous parishioners who are committed so much to the Lord's church and service to Him?

The church's "do-it-ourselves janitorial service" has been and still is a roaring success. These are very committed people, and the church has *NEVER* been so clean and safe. Pastor Mike said he now knows why the ocean is blue. It's because the water in the toilet bowls is always blue and it goes into the ocean! Ha ha. Being on a team like this is a lot of work; however, with that comes great fellowship and satisfaction.

The Trustees approved classrooms 4 and 5 to be used for a new upcoming Jr. High through High School Youth Group – AWAKEN – which is going really well. Furniture and needed supplies were obtained, almost all being funded via private donations, including a 12' x 20' carpet remnant and binding.

Another carpet remnant was obtained, cut, and laid in both the men's and women's baptism dressing rooms. Thank you, Diane, who is not even a Trustee, for measuring, cutting and laying the carpet. The dressing rooms also were cleared of all the supplies, etc. from Covid-19 protection measures in the Sanctuary, and they were taken to a part of classroom 1 (now storage room). This has been great since recently there were four baptisms.

The Trustees held a Workday in November. Over 20 people showed up to help. It was a roaring success. All of the items that had been stored behind the screens in Satow Hall were sorted, organized, and stored in classroom 1. This was a major

undertaking. Then the furniture and side pews were taken out to the parking lot so the carpets could be cleaned. All of the cupboards and drawers in the Crone Hall kitchen were thoroughly cleaned and reorganized. The shed was cleared out, sorted and rearranged. Wood chips behind Issei Hall were spread. Gutters were inspected and some were treated. Extra pesticide spraying was performed. All the light globes in Satow Hall were replaced. Various missing light covers were installed.

Yattiyr Hybrid School had outgrown the church's facilities and relocated elsewhere. While they are a great school, their move released numerous classrooms just in time for upcoming needs.

Last, but not least, a new, and expensive, controller for the Marquee out front was funded by a private donation. What a joy it is to have the sign back.

Thanks to everyone who helped work on these projects, provided funding for many of them, and who were cheerleaders and supporters with their prayers, and also with food.

The Trustees are still moving forward with more projects. Because of the heavy rain at the end of last year, invasive grass has taken over the city, which includes the church grounds. A lawn mower and weed eater could not do the job. A "weed mower" was found for half price and it has been a life saver. Other equipment was donate and we now have enough to keep the grounds up.

Lights for the overhead screens needed replacing which entailed Pastor Mike spending a long time on a 24-foot ladder just to disconnect them and bring them down. Pretty scary to watch, so we just kept praying for safety! It's amazing how many things are on the ceilings or in the attic that need tending to!

The last Trustee meeting a few weeks ago was over two hours long, and we came away with about 34 things "to do," and each person has his and her own list. With that, I think I'll closed this report and go take a nap!





During this time, we received an ad from a local realtor, listing 30 churches in our area which had closed and were selling their property. It asked if we wanted to sell. There were never any such plans.

Just a few months ago, Andorful introduced us to an amazing young man and his family whose passion and expertise is youth ministry, and plans got underway to bring back to life a Jr. High through High School program. Youth are the future, of the church, of this country, and everywhere else. Once again, parishioners donated items, including a karaoke machine, and on the "very day" that a plea was going out for sofas, my next-door neighbor (unaware of all this) texted me to say they were giving away their sofa set and did we know of anyone who may need it because they just put it on the street! This beautiful leather sofa, love seat and captain's chair now sit in the youth room.

Tending to God's church is a joy and a joint endeavor by all of us. While we miss our long-time parishioners who have gone home to Jesus, they will always be much appreciated. Others are now home-bound and unable to come back. They will always be much appreciated and sorely missed. We also have new and wonderful people who the Lord has brought to us. Four recently have completed the New Membership Class. Four parishioners are scheduled to be baptized this coming January 2, 2022. Several new board members also will be up for election to office in January. God is still in the business of releasing us. His hands are always there for us, and we are always under the wings of His angels.

I encourage you to bring family and friends to experience the presence of the Lord during services, fellowship with each other, participate in ministry activities, and attend upcoming fellowship dinners and potluck/movie nights.

While it can be said that we are rising from the ashes, there is something else. All the while we have been safe in the hands of God, who, in His timing, slowly released us little by little to return to worshiping together and carrying out His Great Commission.

In the midst of a world in darkness, Mayhew CBC has a great opportunity to be a shining light on a hill during 2022 and thereafter. Matthew 5:14-15.




